2) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

Exceptions to the semester study abroad requirement may be made on a case-by-case basis in a petition to the department and in consultation with a department academic advisor. Language-intensive replacements may include a year living in a French theme house, intensive summer study, etc.
