NOTES:

The Classics and Ancient Mediterranean Studies department offers **two tracks** for its major: Classical Languages and Classical Studies. This is the suggested four-year program for a Classical Languages major (Separate curriculum guide for the Classical Studies major). **Students who are considering graduate school in Classics should choose the Language track and consult with a faculty member as soon as possible about taking additional units of Greek and Latin.**

- Completion of five units of either Greek or Latin: three units of either Greek or Latin at the 200+ level **and** two units at any level in the other ancient language. Completion of CLSC 101 plus 2.5 additional Classical Civilization units; One unit from: CLSC 210-220 or HIST 112; one unit from CLSC 230-240; 0.5 units (2 semesters) of CLSC 100 (proseminar) activity credit.
- 1) Greek or Latin 301 may be repeated for credit.
- 2) One additional course in Classical Civilization, numbered 299+ from the following: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 101, 120, 130, 181, 210, 211, 212, 230, 231, 232, 233, 280/SOAN 280, 320, 321, 322, 323, 330, 339, 375; CONN 377; HIST 112; PHIL 361; PHYS 299; PG 340; STS 201.
- 3) Senior thesis (CLSC 490). In the semester prior to registration for CLSC 490, students must complete a Thesis Proposal form and submit it for approval to their thesis advisor and the Department Chair. Contact the Department Chair for more information on the thesis/approval process.
- 4) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
- At least five major units must be completed at Puget Sound.

- 1) CLSC 101 can be completed in first or second year and is not a prerequisite to other Classics and Ancient Mediterranean Studies courses.
- 2) Three units of either Greek or Latin at the 200+ level
- 3) Two units, at any level, in the **other** ancient language (Greek or Latin 301 may be repeated for credit).
- *One additional course in Classical Civilization, numbered 299+ from the following: ARTH 360, 361; CLSC 101, 120, 130, 180, 181, 210, 211, 212, 230, 231, 232, 233, 280/SOAN 280, 320, 321, 322, 323, 330, 339, 375; CONN 377; HIST 112; PHIL 361; PHYS 299; PG 340: STS 201.
- **CLSC 490 to be taken after both the required 200-level Classical Civilization courses and Greek or Latin 201(or their equivalents) have been completed. In the semester prior to registration for CLSC 490, students must complete a Thesis Proposal form and submit it for approval to their thesis advisor and the Department Chair. Contact the Department Chair for more information on the thesis/approval process.
- Since the Classical Language track requires at least 5 terms of Greek or Latin, students must normally begin language study by first semester sophomore year to complete the major in their fourth year. Students entering Puget Sound with prior Latin or Greek experience should consult with a faculty member about placement and adjustments to major requirements.

At least five units in the major must be completed at Puget Sound.
