- **Four additional units from the following: GERM 300, 305, 310, 315, 365, 395, 420, 450, 480; CONN 330, 333; HIST 224, 311, 317, 320, 322, 325, 335; P&G 321. Two of these units must be taken during the senior year and include one upper-level GERM seminar (400+; conducted in German) and one HIST 300+ seminar course (or CONN 333). No more than two units can be from German.

***Senior paper to be completed during a seminar course (GERM 400+ or HIST 300+).
