Area B: REL 231, 233, 234, 300, 328, 332, 334, 335.

Area C: REL 220, 265, 270, 272, 292, 302, 315, 323, 325, 368; CONN 318. \*\*REL 270 is required for the Religion and Social Justice Concentration.

Area D: REL 410, 420, 430, 440, 444, 450, 456, 460, 470, 494.

Area E: REL 202, 208, 215, 301, 305, 307, 330, 495/496; CONN 344.

REL 495/496 counts as an elective toward the major, and not as an advanced seminar.

\*\*Students wishing to complete the Religion and Social Justice Concentration are required to complete this four-course sequence: REL 270, REL 399, one of REL 202, 203, 215, 265, 272, 292, or 298 and one of REL 301, 302, 305, 307, 322, 323, 325, 330, 368, 465 or CONN 318.
