Advanced Placement Examination Policy - Effective Fall 2020 for May 2020 Examinations

(Exams taken in previous years will be awarded credit per the Fall 2019/2018/2017 policies)

This chart outlines the units and course exemptions granted by the University of Puget Sound for Advanced Placement Examinations. AP results may apply as elective credit, as Core-fulfilling courses (for students matriculating in Fall 2018 and subsequent semesters), or to a major/minor, as determined by the relevant academic department at Puget Sound.

Credit awarded for examination results counts toward the 16 unit transfer credit maximum allowed toward an undergraduate degree. Students enrolling at Puget Sound with freshman or sophomore standing (less than 15 total units initially transferred) may complete up to four Core Areas via transfer credit; students enrolling with junior standing (15+ total units) may complete up to five Core Areas via transfer credit.
