
Note from Sally

• Travel Information

If you are planning to go home for the holiday, or travel out of the country, please make sure you have all of your documents that verify your student status:

- Valid passport;
- I-94;
- SEVIS I-20. Please check the last page of your I-20 – it must be signed by Sally to be valid for travel out of the country;
- Proof of enrollment or official transcript (available from the Registrar's Office) to show that you are registered for Spring Semester 2009;
- Sally's business card or contact information.

• Visa Renewal

If you have an **expired visa** and will be leaving the US, you will have to apply for a new visa in order to re-enter the country.

Expect a delay in visa processing in your home country; apply early!
