TRAVEL SIGNATURES!

Please make sure to check the travel signatures on your I-20 to confirm that it has been signed by Sally in the last 8 months. If you need to have me sign it again, please come to the office before December 16th when I will be leaving for the holiday

Travel Documents

Before you head out for vacation or a visit home, make sure you have all of your documents that verify your student status. When you travel anywhere in the US or abroad you should carry with you:

- 1) valid passport
- 2) I-94
- 3) properly endorsed I-20* or DS-2019
 *signed by me within the last 8 months
 4) proof of enrollment or official transcript (available from the Registrar's Office)
- 5) My business card This is always a good back-up document to carry because, if for any reason you are stopped at a Port of Entry, I am the first person that the Customs Officer will call to verify your status
