- 2) One unit of BIOL 101, 102, 111 or the AP equivalent (these courses can satisfy the Natural Scientific Core requirement).
- 3) Three elective units distributed as follows: Scientific (up to 1 course), Ethical (up to 2 course), and Humanities & Social Sciences (up to 2 courses). See Bulletin for list of elective options.
- 4) BIOE/REL 292 or BIOE/PHIL 292 is a prerequisite for BIOE 392 and BIOE 400.
- 5) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.
