PERFORMER

Anand Landon is a guitarist, bassist, singer, arranger, and composer. After graduating from Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, Calif., Landon began his studies with classical guitar under the tutelage of Doug B. Rice. After taking lessons with him for a year, he moved on to study Jazz with Tracy Knoop. Since his sophomore year, Landon has been keen on honing his skills as a guitarist and jazz musician as well as an arranger and composer. He is the beatboxer for the mixed competitive a cappella group Underground Sound, which he directed for one year along with Puget Sound alumna Polina Davydov. He also regularly arranges for this group and they have gone on to compete in ICCA's and they have placed 2nd in the quarter finals as of 2017. In addition, the organization of ICCA's awarded Landon with the best beatboxer award in 2017 and the best arrangement award in 2018. Landon sang with the Adelphians concert choir under the direction of Steven Zopfi for two years as well as playing bass, guitar, and djembe for the group. He did the same thing for Chorale his freshman year. He is currently the guitarist and electric bassist for the Puget Sound jazz orchestra under the direction of his teacher Tracy Knoop.

Anand was the lead guitarist for the musical "Rent" under the direction of Jess K. Smith and Dawn Padula. Over his time at Puget Sound, Landon has been building connections in the greater Tacoma area with the help of Tracy Knoop. Currently, he is the lead guitarist for pop/rock band 48 Degrees North and plays in a local dance band called Candy Shoppe. He also was recruited by TCC big band director Eric Stevens to join a septet with very prestigious musicians of the Tacoma Area. In addition to these groups, Landon is regularly recruited to play in various projects mainly consisting of jazz/rhythm and blues, but has branched out to pop, folk, and even heavy metal. He currently teaches at All Star Guitar in Gig Harbor and plans to continue working there post graduation and hopefully go on tour with 48 Degrees North as well as becoming a well known jazz guitarist in the Tacoma-Seattle area. In addition, Landon wants to release a solo EP of the various arrangements and compositions he has made over the years and wants to further immerse himself in the contemporary music scene of Tacoma and Seattle.
