NOTES

- 1) Entrance audition required for acceptance to the major.
- 2) Only courses in which a C- or better is earned will count toward the major.
- 3) Music majors must attain, maintain membership in, attend, and be registered for credit in the appropriate major university ensemble (band, orchestra, choir or Accompanying Ensemble) during all semesters in which they are enrolled. Music majors electing a wind or percussion instrument as their principal performing medium are required to participate in the Wind Ensemble, Concert Band, or Symphony Orchestra, as assigned; string instruments in the Symphony Orchestra; voice students in the Adelpian Concert Choir, Chorale, or the Dorian Singers, as assigned; keyboard majors in a minimum of the first four semesters in Accompanying Ensemble; and guitar students in any of the above ensembles. Students may elect to perform in additional ensembles if they desire and are qualified
- 4) To advance to the junior year, a student must have a 2.3 overall grade point average, a 2.5 music grade point average, and demonstrate excellence in the jury of their major performance instrument in the spring jury of the sophomore year.
- 5) Music majors must register for Recital Attendance every semester they are in residence (MUS 109 as freshmen and sophomores; MUS 309 as juniors and seniors).
- 6) Students wishing to study abroad are encouraged to do so in the spring semester of their junior year.

For students whose primary instrument is keyboard, this requirement includes Accompanying Ensemble (MUS 282) in the first four semesters.

Students planning to study musicology or composition at the graduate level should consult the Bulletin for additional details.
